


IT ALL STARTS WITH NI HAO



Singapore's bustling economy and vibrant cultural landscape make it one of the most alluring places to visit in Asia. Singapore is located at the tip of the Malay Peninsula and is the multicultural home of ethnic Chinese, Malays, Indians, Arabs and Eurasians, as well as expatriates from all over the world. It is one of the few remaining city-states on Earth, and the smallest country in Southeast Asia, yet its small size encapsulates an economic powerhouse.

Since its independence from England in 1963 and Malaysia in 1965, Singapore has become a financial nexus of Southeast Asia. The nation's unique blend of culture, art, cuisine, commerce and architecture draw visitors from all over the world. Within Asia, this prosperous country is a go-to for world-class shopping, dining and entertainment.

You'll see towering skyscrapers, their gleaming exteriors hiding the next great technological breakthrough. Take in a visit to the National Orchid Garden, a lush oasis boasting a colorful display of 60,000 of these exotic flowers, to understand why Singapore is known as "The Garden City."



THE RITZ-CARLTON, MILLENIA

The lobby will make you feel like you're in the Crystal Palace at the 1851 World's Fair and the rooms are luxurious in an old school sort of way.

If you're a fan of classic pampering it doesn't get better than this: a plush room with the country's most iconic view of Marina Bay (and the Sands' nightly light show), and the convenience of being connected to one of Singapore's prime tourist areas.

There's even a direct linkway to the Millenia Walk mall.

Cavernous, slightly chaotic, and nearly always crowded—this isn't just a hotel. It's a destination unto itself. You're in one of the country's most Instagrammed hotspots.

The world's largest rooftop infinity pool is on the 57th floor and open only to hotel guests. It's so social media-worthy that non-guests have tried sneaking into the area just to steal a shot.

The property also has a bunch of restaurants by celebrity chefs that are among Singapore's best, and it has the city's poshest casino.

RAFFLES SINGAPORE

It can't be easy being a living legend, a global icon, an object of universal reverence. What happens when, eventually, you have to renovate and possibly even change?

In the case of Raffles Singapore, you do so in a way that appears effortless and natural. The good news at this 133-year-old classic is that all that was irreplaceable has been preserved, down to the wicker chairs and ceiling fans that provide so much ambience.

THE ST. REGIS SINGAPORE

In a neighborhood of modern, glass-paneled apartment blocks, the St. Regis stands out with its fleet of imposing bronze Bentley limousines parked outside.

It's all unapologetically decadent: butler service is available at the push of a button, the rooms are positively palatial, and the hotel's award-winning spa is consistently voted among Singapore's best.



INTERCONTINENTAL

You'd expect an international luxury brand to be in the mainstream tourist area or central business district, but this busy InterContinental—in the heart of Singapore's Malay-influenced Kampong Glam neighborhood—is where the locals hang.

A close connection to the rich Malay and Peranakan cultures influences much of the design here. The sumptuous lobby lounge is a popular place for high tea.

But for a suitably Peranakan treat, head to the nofrills HarriAnns Nonya Table in the adjoining mall for awesome kueh.

THE FULLERTON HOTEL

GOODWOOD PARK HOTEL



GENERAL INFORMATION

Welcome to Singapore

Best described as a microcosm of modern Asia, Singapore is a melting pot of culture and history, and an extravaganza of culinary delights. Officially known as the Republic of Singapore, it is both a city and a country located in Southeast Asia. One of Asia's most visited destinations, Singapore is best described as an amalgam of a fast-paced life and an off-the-back-street inheritance.

Singapore is the quintessential cosmopolitan, having the highest religious diversity in any country. Spread 42 km (26 miles) east to west and 23 km (14 miles) north to south, today it boasts of the world's busiest port. Singapore has climbed to be one of Asia's hit-list destinations with its efficient

Climate

Due to its geographical location and maritime exposure, Singapore's climate is characterised by uniform temperature and pressure, high humidity and abundant rainfall. The average temperature is between 25 degrees Celsius and 31 degrees Celsius. Thunderstorms occur on 40% of all days. Relative humidity is in the range of 70% – 80%. April is the warmest month, January is the coolest month and November is the wettest month.

Currency

The Singapore dollar is the official currency of Singapore. Normally abbreviated with the dollar sign \$ or S\$ to distinguish it from other dollar-denominated currencies, it is divided into 100 cents. The issuance of banknotes and coins of the Singapore dollar lies with the Monetary Authority of Singapore.

Population

The population of Singapore is diverse, the result of considerable past immigration. Chinese predominate, making up some three-fourths of the total. Malays are the next largest ethnic group, and Indians the third. None of those three major communities is homogeneous.


Language

The national language of Singapore is Malay while English, Malay, Mandarin Chinese, and Tamil are the four official languages in Singapore. English is the most widely spoken language (primarily by the population below the age of 50), and the medium of instructions in school. English is also the language of business and government in Singapore, based on British English. A unique and widely spoken language in Singapore is the Singlish.

Religion


Religious affiliations reflect ethnic patterns. About two-thirds of all Chinese profess some degree of attachment to Confucianism, Buddhism, or Daoism or to some combination thereof. Virtually all Malays, and some Indians, adhere to Islam, which is the formal religion of about one-seventh of the population.

The Christian community has grown rapidly to become comparable in size to the Muslim population; nearly all Christians are Chinese. Almost all of the remaining population practicing a religion is Hindu, but there are also many Singaporeans who have no religious affiliation.



BEST OF JEWEL


Walk around this architectural marvel that's both an airport terminal and a shopping mall and check out eye-catching attractions like the 40-metre high HSBC Rain Vortex, the world's tallest indoor waterfall. You'll also visit shops such as Naiise, a multi-label lifestyle retailer that stocks an eclectic mix of locally-inspired items ranging from homeware to stationery, and heritage brands like Bengawan Solo – a household name known for its traditional cakes and kueh (bite-sized desserts).



DHOBIS, SARIS & CURRY SPOT

Experience the sights, sounds, and tastes of Little India in this tour that immerses you in the fascinating Hindu culture.

The tour includes stops at Komala Vilas, Little India's oldest restaurant, for a classic Indian breakfast, the market at Tekka Centre to discover exotic fruits and vegetables, Little India Arcade to learn how to tie a sari—a traditional Indian womenswear—and a temple for an insight into Hinduism.



Swing by Kampong Gelam, Singapore's oldest quarter, to get to know the culture and traditions of the Malay community and Islam. Discover the origins of the old Royal Palace and Sultan Mosque.

You'll also be taught how to tie a sarong (a large length of fabric often wrapped around the waist and worn by men and women throughout most of Indonesia). Don't miss Haji Lane—one of Singapore's most popular streets known for its cool backdrops and quirky shops.





CHINATOWN FOOD WALK

Get an insider look into Chinatown's famous alleyways, where street hawkers serve some of Singapore's most celebrated dishes.

Discover how chefs source for and prepare ingredients based on well-loved Chinese recipes handed down from one generation to the next, and learn the legacy behind these Chinese dishes. The tour comes with samplings of over 10 popular local Chinese dishes—get ready to eat!

MARINA BAY NIGHT TOUR

When the sun goes down, take a leisurely ride along the Singapore River and Kallang River to discover the bustling restaurants and pubs along Clarke Quay and Boat Quay. See the Formula One Pit Building and catch the bright lights of the Singapore Flyer.

You'll also visit the National Stadium, a state-ofthe-art sports venue that has the world's largest free-span dome; Marina Barrage, a dam that doubles up as a lush recreational park; and the futuristic-looking Supertrees at Gardens by the Bay.



SINGAPORE UP CLOSE

This tour gives you an authentic local experience by taking you into Singapore's heartlands.

The walking tour focuses on Toa Payoh-the country's first satellite town established by the Housing Development Board-shedding light on Singapore's housing history and its communities.

Also, catch a glimpse of everyday life in a typical neighbourhood and stop by a local coffee shop for a uniquely Singapore tea break.



HARMONY OF SENSES

Get ready for a feast for the senses! Visit Fort Sanctuary to sip on the finest teas; stroll along the Helix Bridge and admire its double helix DNA design; and watch an outdoor light and water show at Marina Bay Sands and the Garden Rhapsody light and sound show at Gardens by the Bay.

To cap your evening, you'll head up to the 57th floor of the CÉ LA VI–a restaurant, sky bar and club lounge–for drinks.



A MELTING POT OF TEA

Singapore was once the main trading hub for tea leaves in the region. Its diverse cultures, traditions, beliefs, and identities helped the local tea business to thrive, and the country was united by the common love for tea.



Endless options include the best of fine dining and multi-course omakase sets to heritage eats at generations-old restaurants in enclaves to trendy eateries reinventing street food into modern offerings.

Day 02: Singapore

Today, cover the three cultural enclaves of Singapore and discover each of their delicious eats. Stroll Kampong Glam, the Malay heritage district, and observe the quotidian scene. Stop by a local restaurant here and taste the favorite Malay dish, nasi lemak. Explore the vibrant Indian enclave of Little India and check out Tekka Market, a one-stop shop for locals to buy groceries, do shopping, and dine at the food court.

Day 03: Singapore

Rest this morning and head out in the late morning. Today you will follow the throngs of locals to a hawker center, a food center serving a variety of affordable, local favorites from chicken rice, fried kway teow to Hokkien mee and bean curd. Maxwell Center's Tian Tian chicken rice made Anthony Bourdain sing praises, while Old Airport Road Food Center has a few stalls that have garnered Michelin Bib Gourmand listings.

Day 04: Singapore

Start the day with a favorite Singaporean breakfast of buttered toast with kaya jam, soft boiled eggs, and a cup of strong 'kopi.' Do as the locals do and dip the bread in the eggs dashed with dark soy sauce and a dusting of white pepper.

Stroll Joo Chiat, the heart of the Peranakan enclave, dotted with colorful pastel-hued shophouses with ornate facades.

Visit a shophouse famous for its Nyonya rice dumplings and be welcomed by its owner. Sample the famed rice dumplings and sweet bite-sized snacks.

While in the neighborhood, have lunch at a local Peranakan restaurant to sample popular dishes such as Katong laksa, a seafood noodle soup flavored with coconut milk and spices.



Day 01: Singapore

Arrive at Changi Airport and meet your guide for your private transfer to your hotel. Relax and unwind from your flight for the rest of the day. In the evening, wildlife enthusiasts may want to get up close to nocturnal and crepuscular animals at Singapore Zoo's Night Safari. This after-dark adventure lets visitors see over 130 species including threatened species in a natural environment simulating native habitats.

Day 02: Singapore

Leave the city to breathe in fresh early morning air on a treetop walk at MacRitchie Reservoir Park. Keep an eye open for flying lemurs, owls, and long-tailed macaques while strolling amongst the forest canopy. Take on the 11km nature trail loop through tropical rainforest or opt for leisurely walks along the water's edge and admire the serenity of the reservoir. Back in the city, head to the Gardens by the Bay, a 250-acre futuristic nature park, home to plants from around the world.

Day 03: Singapore

Spend the day on Pulau Ubin, a small island an hour away from the city that recalls a time when the city-state's infrastructure was limited to wooden house villages and wooden jetties, and surrounded by wildlife. Considered the last kampong or native village, Pulau Ubin exhibits a rural idull with its working village wells and absence of electric power lines. Explore the island on foot or by bicycle.

Day 04: Singapore

Today, spend the morning at another one of Singapore's top hiking areas, Bukit Timah Nature Reserve which encompasses many smaller parks and areas offering many different hiking trails.

Start at the Visitor Center to learn about the varieties of flora and fauna found in the park through interactive touchscreens and informative forest ecology and tree-spotting displaces.

Day 05: Singapore

Stroll Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve, another wetland ecosystem that is easier to traverse with wooden plank trails through its tidal ponds and mangrove forests.

An ecological jewel and haven for wildlife, its native inhabitants include mudskippers, crabs, water snakes, birds, monitor lizards, otters, and more. Spot resident birds such as herons, king fishers and sunbirds while migratory birds such as the great egret, marsh sandpiper and Himalayan swiftlet visit in the fall through winter.


TIPPING POLICY

- · As other members of your group would be flying from different cities/towns/countries, you would be required to wait for some time so that they can join you at the arrival area as common airport pick- up facility is provided for the entire group.
- · Also in view of the common airport drop facility provided for your group, you would be required to travel to the airport along with other group members even though your flight time is later than other members of your group.
